This funding will be used to

- Ensure that all students achieve NAPLAN national minimum standards in Years 3 and 5 in all areas; or there will be individual performance plans in place for all students who are identified at risk of not achieving this standard.
- Continue to develop the capacity of instructional leaders, teachers and teacher aides to improve student learning outcomes through the provision of –
 - Ongoing professional development to improve the teaching of literacy and numeracy
 - Focused coaching and feedback processes to improve the quality and consistency of teacher pedagogy
- Actively engaged with the North Coast Region *Clarity* initiative, working with Dr Lyn Sharratt and Assistant Regional Director, to boost student achievement and build teacher capacity to learn, teach and lead.
- Provide targeted intervention, extension, and support to students

- Increasing Support Teacher Literacy and Numeracy time, with a clear focus on strengthening staff capability through observations and feedback, early diagnosis, targeted intervention, pre Prep Program, and the focused application of teacher aide time **\$61,000**
- Engaging with, and advancing STEM in curriculum planning, teaching and learning **\$62,000**




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- Targeting student needs with additional teacher aide time **\$102,611**
